ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AHMEK/WAPOMEO CAMPERS

- COTTON RETAINS 40% INSULATION, WHILE WOOL RETAINS 80% INSULATION WHEN WET.
- YOUNGER CAMPERS MAY NEED MORE SHEETS, UNDERWEAR, PYJAMAS, AND PLASTIC BED SHEETS. IT IS PREFERABLE THAT CAMPERS TRAVEL TO AND FROM CAMP IN "CAMP CLOTHES".
- WHILE IN CAMP, WE ADVISE THAT CAMPERS USE SHEETS AND BLANKETS AS BEDDING. A SLEEPING BAG IS BEST SUITED FOR TRIPPING AND SHOULD BE CONSIDERED AS ESSENTIAL.
- RAINGEAR SHOULD BE EASILY ACCESSIBLE IN CASE OF INCLEMENT WEATHER WHILE ARRIVING AT CAMP.
- ALL CLOTHES SHOULD BE MACHINE WASHABLE.
- LAUNDRY FOR CAMPERS IS DONE EVERY 8-9 DAYS ON A CABIN GROUP AND SECTION BASIS. THE LAUNDRY IS COLLECTED IN THE MORNING AND IS BACK TO THE CAMPER THAT NIGHT. IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT ALL ARTICLES BE PLAINLY MARKED WITH THE CAMPER'S FULL NAME.
- *PLEASE NOTE: BE SURE TO HAVE IRON-ON LABELS THAT STAY ON CLOTHING.*
- WE WOULD LIKE TO POINT OUT THE PROBABILITY OF LOSS OR DAMAGE TO CAMPER BELONGINGS AND WE SUGGEST THAT CAMPERS AVOID BRINGING EXPENSIVE AND/OR VALUABLE ITEMS TO CAMP-- ITEMS SUCH AS CAMERAS OR WATCHES, SHOULD BE RELATIVELY INEXPENSIVE AND WATERPROOF. IPODs, JEWELRY ETC, SHOULD NOT BE BROUGHT TO CAMP. WE EMPHASIZE THE NEED FOR POSITIVE IDENTIFICATION ON EACH ARTICLE. WE WOULD ALSO LIKE TO POINT OUT THAT WE CANNOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY ARTICLES BROUGHT TO CAMP.
- **WE STRONGLY ASK THAT CAMPER VALUABLES INCLUDING MONEY AND PASSPORTS BE DEPOSITED IN OUR CAMP BUSINESS OFFICE SAFE.** CAMPERS MAY ACCESS THESE ITEMS IF NECESSARY. PLEASE DISCUSS THIS WITH YOUR SON OR DAUGHTER.

PLEASE PACK ALL ITEMS FOR CAMP, INCLUDING BEDDING IN A HOCKEY OR DUFFLE BAG AND ENCLOSE THIS LIST FOR CHECKING PURPOSES WHEN RETURNING HOME.



PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT SANDALS, TEVA'S AND FLIP FLOPS ARE NOT ENCOURAGED AS THEY CAN LEAD TO FOOT INJURIES (IE. ROUGH CAMP TERRAIN, CAMP FIRES.)

- **WAPOMEQ:** GIRLS (12 YEARS AND OVER) ARE ASKED TO BRING SANITARY NAPKINS/TAMPONS EVEN IF THIS IS JUST PRECAUTIONARY. *IMPORTANT - TAMPONS MUST HAVE BIODEGRADABLE APPLICATORS.*
- **TRUNKS SHOULD BE AVOIDED AS THEY ARE VERY DIFFICULT TO TRANSPORT TO THE CAMPER CABINS**
- **Please Note:** When Wapomeo campers visit Ahmek for Inter-camp days **one piece bathing suits or tankini's need to be worn.** Please ensure that your Wapomeo camper comes with appropriate swimwear.
